

BRASSIE

This Brassie is a very popular Midge Pupa pattern. I like it because it is very easy to tie, even in smaller sizes. The fact that fish like it is an added bonus.

This fly works well in many colors and sizes. You can also use Larva Lace Dead Soft Copper Wire. One thing you want to remember that your wire should not be larger than your hook wire diameter. Before you head out to go fishing make sure to have a few varieties of the Brassie tied.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

HOOK | LL Hook #60 Nymph Hook | Size 14-22

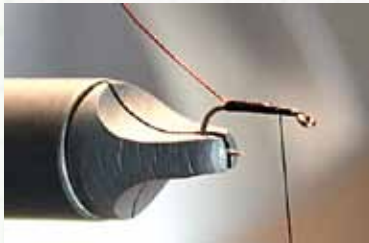
HEAD | LL Mohair Plus Dubbing | Black

BODY | LL Dead Soft Copper Wire | 32 gauge

THREAD | Flymaster Plus | 140 or 210 Denier | Black

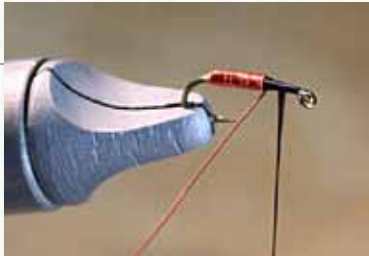
HEAD CEMENT | Soft Body | Thin

VICE | Hagen's Deluxe Fly Tying Vice with Midge Jaw



« Step 1

Lay a smooth bed of thread down. Tie in copper wire forward, so your thread is at the point where you will tie in the head.



« Step 2

Wrap the copper wire forward around the hook shank. You want the wire wraps to be touching but not overlapping. Tie off and clip excess.



« Step 3

Select a small clump of Mohair and "dub" it on the thread. Wrap forward to make head. Make sure to leave enough room to whip finish and apply soft body.
