

## PEACOCK DEER HAIR CADDIS

TIED BY: Lorie Hagen

This is a great fly for those darker colored caddis species. It can also be tied as a elk hair caddis. You can also tie this fly with a full, bushy wing to provide added buoyancy. Make sure to have a few ready for your next trip on the water.

**MATERIALS NEEDED:**

**HOOK** | 305 Dry Fly | Size 12-18

**BODY** | Peacock Herl

**WING** | Deer Hair| Light

**THREAD** | Uni | Tan

**BOBBIN** | Rite Half Hitch

**VICE** | Hagen's Deluxe Fly Tying Vice with Midge Jaw



### « Step 1

Start your thread behind the eye of the hook.

Take 2 peacock herls and tie in. Wrap your thread over the peacock herl to the bend of the hook and back up to the eye.



### « Step 2

Take your 2 peacock herls together and wrap up to the eye of the hook to form the body.

Tie off and trim excess.



### « Step 3

Take a clump of deer hair and clean and stack. Place it on top of the hook shank so the tips reach the bend of the hook. Make a couple of loose wraps with your thread then tighten. Add a couple of more tight wraps. Now take a few of the butt ends of the deer hair and pull back and wrap your thread through them. Repeat until you have all the deer hair back, make a couple of thread wraps to push the hair back. Make a couple of half hitch's and trim off thread. Now you need to pull the butt ends of the hair forward over and trim at a angle to make the head of your fly.
