

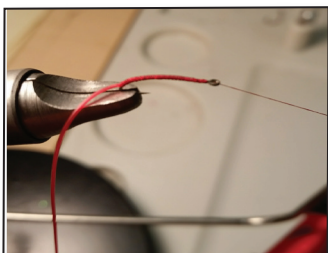
MIDGE LARVA TIED BY: Lorie Hagen

This fly is easy to tie and it catches fish. Midge larva are probably the most important food source for trout. They are always in the water, and there are times of the year that the fish will feed exclusively on these. So you must make sure and always have a supply of midge larvae imitators on hand. You can match the color to the water you are fishing. You can use different colors of Midge Lace or use the clear with colored thread.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

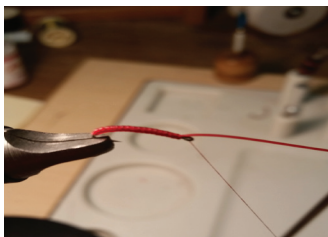
- HOOK** | 270 natural bend | Sz 16-24
- THREAD** 8/0 red
- BODY** | Midge Lace | Red
- VICE** | Hagen's Deluxe Stainless Steel Vice
- BOBBIN** | Rite Bobbin | Half Hitch Mag

« Step 1

Start your thread behind the eye of the hook Tie a piece of midge lace and wrap your thread toward the rear, you want to go just past the bend of the hook with nice even wraps. Bring your thread back up to the eye of the hook and place a half hitch. Place your bobbin on the bobbin rest.

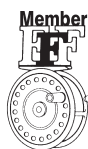


« Step 2

Take the Midge Lace you tied in and wrap forward with nice even wraps, you do not want to overlap the midge. Tie off with a couple of thread wraps and trim excess. Whip finish.
