

SERENDIPITY

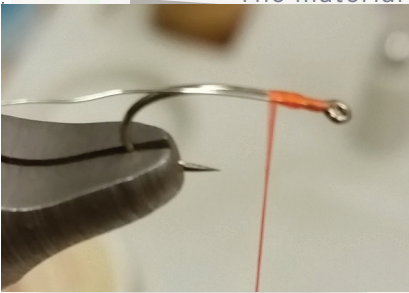

The Serendipity is a classic all around fly. It can be fished as a midge emerger or a nymph. You can use different materials for the body like Shimmer, twisted into a rope. Red, green, olive, burgundy and black are also great colors to use. You can also tie this fly in a variety of sizes, the smaller the better.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

HOOK | 125 Emerger | Sz 12-24
THREAD | Danville | Fl. Orange | 140 Denier
WIRE | SILVER | 32 GAGUE
WING | Deer Hir | Light
VICE | Hagen's Deluxe Stainless Steel Vice
BOBBIN | Rite Bobbin | Half Hitch Mag
WHIP FINISHING TOOL

« Step 1

Start your thread behind the eye of the hook, make a couple of wraps and tie in your silver wire. Wrap back to the bend of the hook.



« Step 2

Bring your thread back to the eye of the hook. Wrap the silver wire forward to rib the body. Tie off the wire and trim. Make sure to leave room to tie in the wing.



« Step 3

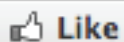
Tie in a clump of deer hair, butts forward. Trim the butt ends close to the thread. Lift the wing and trim to about half the body length. Build up the head of the fly with your thread and whip finish.
