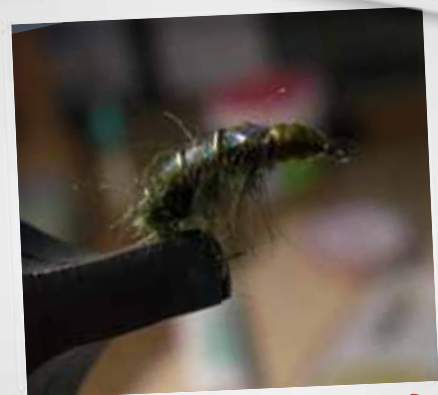

Bighorn River Montana

This was my first trip to the Bighorns with a group of old pro's. We arrived at our cabin at 1 pm and we were on the water by 2, a stretch called three mile. River flows were above normal at 7,000 cubic feet per second the average being around 3,300. **I started the first day of fishing with four orange scuds tied with Larva Lace material and ended the day with only one.** I kept that fly to try and match it to what I needed to buy at the fly shop. I purchased a total of 16 different variations of the orange scud from the two fly shops in the Bighorns with results under matched that of the flies tied with your material. **The colors produced in your orange Mohair material made ALL the difference from 4-5 fish an hour to 4-5 fish a day.** I've included a couple of pictures of the trip.
